Participants will:

- Give concrete examples of how teachers use Web 2.0 tools in their classes.
- Understand how teachers plan to use these tools in the delivery of their curricular objectives.
- Explain how technologies such as Weblogs, wikis, podcasts, social bookmarking

sites, RSS feeds and others can deepen learning and increase student achievement

- Identify assessment tools to measure the effectiveness of Read/Write Web technologies in their personal practice and with their students.

### **Assignments/Products**

Participants will:

View and/or listen to a minimum of 16 sessions of the K12 Online Conference

- Post a minimum of one comment, reflection, or response to course discussion board for each session viewed (Minimum 250 Words).
  - 3 options:
    - Write a reflective post about a session on your personal blog and link it to the course discussion board
    - Write a reflective comment on the conference blog and link it to the course discussion board
    - Write a reflective post on the course discussion board
- Read all entries to conference blog, wikis, and transcripts of chat sessions.
- Develop and implement plan to use one of the Web 2.0 tools in your classroom or professional practice. Publish final product of implementation plan in local setting.
- Post project idea and respond to other participants projects.
- Complete one to two page paper reflecting on implementation plan answering the following questions.
  - What was your project?
  - What learning (student or adult) objective(s) was web 2.0 project designed to meet?
  - How effective was the project?
  - What went well?
  - What did you do to contribute to that part going well?
  - What part of the project did not go as well as you would have liked?
  - What could you do next time to improve the project?
